8TH APRIL 2017

ASSOCIATE MEMBERS MEETING

Dr. Shobha Vijender requested the members to take active part in the coming Bal Sanskar Shivir. In both the centers, registration should be started as soon as possible. All members congratulated Smt Asha Jain for her newly born grandson. Kavita Singhal requested to aware the members to be the Swachha Grehi of their own.

Sampurna Appreciates the Supreme Court Order of Upholding Judgement of Death Penalty To Four Criminals in Nirbhaya Case

The Supreme Court judgment of upholding the death penalty to four criminals in the brutal gang rape case is a historical decision. It is the rarest case where Nirbhaya was raped and mutilated by 5 people including a minor. Founder President of Sampurna Dr Shobha Vijender, in a meeting with the associate members, said that this incident brought a shock wave among the citizens of India. People were in pain and tears. The members of Sampurna welcome the decision as it has reimposed faith in criminal justice system. Dr Shobha Vijender further congratulated the parents of Nirbhaya who continuously fought for the justice, not only for their own daughter, but for entire womanhood.

6TH MAY 2017

ASSOCIATE MEMBERS MEETING

Dr. Shobha Vijender, Founder President of Sampurna, welcomed the members present in the meeting. She thanked everyone to be present in the blinding sunlight and searing heat. First, she informed the members that they should be involved in the *Bal Sankar Shivir* at Rajapur and Shalimar Gaon starting from 15th May 2017. *Bal Sankar Shivir* is a regular feature of Sampurna where hundreds of school going children come and participate in day long creative activities. All the members were of the opinion that there is a new and urgent need to advertise about this camp to every street. Secondly, Dr. Shobha read the progress report of the project of the Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission, 2016. According to her, the mission was started on 10th May 2016 with the intension to make the toilets usable in all Delhi Government schools. It was observed that till date, school toilets had no lights, water, exhaust fans, wash basin, doors & door locks as well as soap to wash hands. Sampurna managed to visit every school

under Delhi Govt after every 15 days to check the condition of toilets. In some schools, the situation was worse. Volunteers of Sampurna tried to improve the situation by regular visits, counseling the sweepers and principals as well as providing some materials where it is needed. Dr Shobha Vijender informed that Sampurna would announce the best performing ward leaders soon.

Secondly, best schools would be awarded for their usable toilets. Dr Shobha, in her interaction regarding **Adarsh Mahila Swachha Grehi Project**, said that 143 group housing societies of Sector 9, 13, 14 and extension 13 and 14 would be included in this project. Volunteers were being trained to work in the Big Societies of Sector 15, 18, and 19 in Rohini. The **Mahila Swachha Grehi** project is very elaborate. Hence, Seema Kapoor suggested that male members should be included in the Swachha Grehi Mission. Everybody accepted this and it was decided that in **Adarsh Mahila Swachha Grehi Project**, male members would be included. It was decided that a big function would be organized at Sampurna to celebrate Nirbhaya's birthday.

School Leaders Awarded For Their Efforts In Making The Govt School Toilets Usable

In a press conference held on 19th May, Sampurna NGO awarded school leaders, their wards and assembled Swachh leaders for their tireless efforts in supporting the schools to make their toilets clean and usable for school children. This massive macro level initiative was launched by Sampurna for clean, usable toilets in the Government schools in January 2016. The founder president of Sampurna Dr Shobha Vijender, in her key note address, said more than 3,000 Swachha Grehis participated in **Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission 2016**. It was observed in 2015-2016, that a large number of children in Government Schools have to use toilets without water, no exhaust fan, no tap and the most startling observation

was that there was no soap available in maximum number of school toilets. She further revealed the fact that Swachh Bharat Mission, the dream project of our Prime Minister, is the primary responsibility of every Government. But to learn the habit of keeping the toilets clean and usable is the responsibility of every stakeholder which includes children, parents, Non-Government efforts, PTAs etc.

She congratulated the Vidhansabha Leader Shivani and her leader Ms. Nirmala for winning first prize in the great service to the nation by assisting through their regular visits to toilets of schools and ensuring that they were being maintained by the school management in the best way possible. If any discrepancy is found in the schools, the self-help group has tried to pull in the local donors to do the needed work in the toilets.

An overwhelming situation was observed in Delhi— toilets in the schools situated in the slum areas were in a terribly bad shape. The overall situation of school toilets was good in prominent areas of Delhi. However, urbanized villages were facing an acute problem of water, sewer, electricity etc to name a few. In most of the school toilets, there was no provision of soaps.

Shivani, while sharing her experience before the media persons, said that her area of working is basically of middle and upper middle class. However, the school children were coming majorly from urbanized villages and slums. As such, most of them had either dirty or no toilets in their homes. Thus, Children were trained by their team to use the toilets.

Another experienced and active leader of the project - Anil Goel - suggested that Delhi Government should allow the volunteers of Sampurna to intervene and support the toilets in South Delhi including places like Tughlakabaad, Badarpur and Devli. Toilets in these areas did not have a sewage system and instead, septic tanks were being used, which were not only unhygienic but risky too.

Madhu Das and Anand Dahiya who are the leaders of East Delhi, replied in the conference that awareness program was conducted in East Delhi and proper implementation would start from 1st July 2017 in all schools of Delhi. During the question answer session of the media, Dr Shobha Vijender answered that Smt Chitra Aggarwal, who is the Councilor from Ward no. 58 N, is the winning School leader and her sincere visit to the school toilets has led to the school toilets being much cleaner.

Finally, the results were announced. The first prize was bagged by Nagar Nigam Pratibha Vidyalaya, Prashant Vihar, B Block. The second prize was won by MCD Pratibha School, Sector 9, Rohini while the third prize went to MCD Primary School, Naharpur, Sector-7, Rohini.

Sampurna Salutes The Sacrifice Of Shri Ravinder, E- Rickshaw Driver, Who Laid His Life To Realize The Dream Of Swachh Bharat

Save Environment Movement by Sampurna

Sampurna NGO sponsored Adarsh Mahila Swachha Grehi Abhiyan to celebrate World Environment Day on 05 June 2017. It is to be noted that Sampurna is running **Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission 2016** in approximately 2700 Govt. schools of Delhi. Sampurna is also initiating the management of 153 Group Housing Societies with the following goals

- (a) Segregation of garbage
- (b) Installation of Solar Panels
- (c) Water Harvesting
- (d) Use of Cotton Bags.

Most of the Group Housing Societies of Rohini have started practicing segregation of garbage in their homes. The Swachha Grehi of Rohini Vidhan Sabha, Shivani Gautam motivated the children of Antriksh Apartment to propagate segregation of garbage through poems, dramas and fancy dress shows.

The children, who participated in the celebrations as well as the judges, appreciated the ideas of the children showing many ways to protect the

environment. Top three contestants were awarded prizes. The remaining competitors were awarded certificate of appreciation.

Under the comprehensive project for improvement of environment in totality, in Antriksh Apartment, pits were dug in the field with technical assistance and expertise from a renowned institution to produce green manure from vegetable and other biodegradable waste of the society, by segregation.

The officials informed that the interested girls and women who were 12th passed will start getting salary of Rs. 7,500 from fourth day of 10 day training. The officials also informed that salary will be paid through cheque. They will also be eligible for additional incentives as per rules of the company.

Girls under training with Sampurna actively participated in the orientation sessions. All were happy with the experience. The company officials also informed that interested women willing to serve as per terms and conditions of the company can report to the company on 19th June 2017 with their application and testimonials.

Sampurna thanked officials of Om Innovations for offering jobs to the women trained by the NGO and hoped that the company would continue to assist Sampurna in future also to support Beti Bachao Beti-Padhao campaign of our Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Protest By Sampurna At Janter Manter

Shri Goswami, supported by advocates in this unprecedented meeting, appealed to the Government to award death penalty to those responsible for this heinous crime. Former Deputy Mayor of North Delhi Municipal Corporation, Dr. (Prof.) Neelam Goyal, also condemned killing of innocent Yatris by the terrorists.

All distinguished citizens present in the meeting, while paying their homage to the departed souls, warned countries like Pakistan and China that India will not tolerate treason and terrorism at any cost.

Dr. Shobha Vijender in her short but fiery address said that she wants to ask so called organizations fighting against human right violations if the Amarnath Yatris killed and injured at Anantnag had no human rights? Why have these human right organizations not organized any candle march in support of the killed Yatris from the corridors of Janter Manter?

She said that Amarnath Yatra is not only a matter of religious faith, but also symbolizes Hindu, Muslim and Sikh brotherhood, unity and integrity of India. Therefore, to create hurdles in Amarnath Yatra is to challenge the unity and integrity of India and strict action be taken against terrorists and those aiding them in this heinous crime.

In the end, Dr. Shobha appealed to those present in the audience to inculcate the feeling of nationalism in their families, particularly the children.

Our Muslim Sisters will now have equality of gender and respect in society.

NGO Sampurna which has been working for women empowerment for last thirty years warmly welcomed the verdict of hon'ble Supreme Court declaring *triple talaq* for muslim women as unconstitutional. Dr. Shobha Vijender, founder president of Sampurna, in a press release, said that this will bring positive change in the society for our Muslim sisters. *Triple Talaq* to a women aged 50 years in the name of shariya was a cruel and destructive custom. Prevalence of such a custom, even 70 years after India attained freedom was a question mark for the respect and dignity of Muslim women and therefore, Sampurna gratefully welcomes this unprecedented and historic Supreme Court verdict.

28TH AUGUST 2017

Sampurna Commends Indian Judiciary For Sentencing Baba Ram Rahim To 10 Years In Prison

Referring to the sentence of 10 years imprisonment awarded to Baba Ram Rahim alias Gurmeet Singh, head of *Dera Sacha Sauda*, convicted by CBI Court in a rape case, Sampurna Founder Dr Shobha Vijender and all its volunteers have

praised the judgment of the court and have said that Indian Judiciary have touched new heights in maintaining moral values and dignity in the society. However, they also added that sentence prescribed for crimes like rapes is inadequate and need to be revised to meet the requirement of present times.

They said that betrayal by *babas* like Gurmeet Singh to whom the followers and the society has given everything, cannot be tolerated. Such crimes should have minimum of life imprisonment or death penalty so that no offender dares to commit such a heinous crime with a woman as head of a sect or religious head or head of *dera*.

Dr Shobha Vijender, after consultation with volunteers of Sampurna, said that hearing of heinous crimes like rape should be in fast-track courts on day-to-day basis and the minimum sentence should be life imprisonment or death penalty. It should be known that it took about 15 years to complete hearing in Baba Ram Rahim case which is too long by any standard. The mental stress and strain along with the suffering women might have gone through during these long years and the threat they would have received cannot be imagined.

Dr Shobha Vijender said that Govt should ensure that hearing of such cases should be completed in the shortest possible time and offenders should be awarded strict punishments.

9TH SEPTEMBER 2017

ASSOCIATE MEMBERS MEETING

Dr Shobha Vijender, Founder President of Sampurna, took the associate members meeting. The associate members were enthusiastic about **Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission 2016**. They shared their experiences regarding visiting toilets of Delhi Govt schools.

A meeting with the Director of Education was held with the ward leaders. The open discussion brought many solutions. Sita Ji, one of the ward leaders, told the members that she is welcomed in every school because they believe that volunteers of Sampurna are bringing a significant change in the conditions of toilets. Dr Shobha Vijender motivated them further by appreciating their efforts.

Ms Tanvi told that 80% of the speakers are finalized so far. But there are many more arrangements that need to be done. She requested everyone to register themselves for the event at Constitution Club. Madhumalti, one of the members suggested that Head Office should be renovated. In 21st century, cities are facing a huge problem of juvenile crimes and juveniles. The beneficiaries' numbers need to be enhanced in both the centers.

Sampurna Organizes a Seminar for Making Delhi a Women Friendly City

Sampurna, in association with UN Habitat and UN Women, organized a two-day seminar on '*Making Delhi a Women Friendly City*'. The seminar, spanning over 22nd - 23rd of September, 2017, was held at the Constitution Club of India, New Delhi.

The programme was inaugurated with lighting of the ceremonial lamp by Dr. Shobha Vijender, Founder President of Sampurna. During her welcome speech, she stressed on the need to come together as a community, collaborate, put in the required effort, and brainstorm on possible solutions and recommendations, in order to achieve the desired objective. At the very outset, Dr. Vijender stressed on the need to understand the difference between security and safety; while the former is more tangible, the latter is a feeling, and more abstract in nature. Her speech was followed by speeches from the other dignitaries of the Panel.

Mr. Hitesh Vaidya, the Country Manager, India for UN Habitat, appreciated the efforts of Sampurna for starting a campaign which sought to mobilise and build the capacity of a diverse set of stakeholders on the use of various approaches and tools for women safety. UN Habitat believes that '*a safe city is a just city*'; having

said this, it is welcoming to note that Delhi has decided to revise its Master Plan wherein, safety and security of women will now be included.

Anju Pandey, Programme Specialist, UN Women, emphasized the need for a paradigm shift in the lens through which we look at the need for safety of women; instead go saying that women should be respected because they are ‘women’, they must be respected for the reason that they are human beings; safety of women must be now viewed from the right perspective. Drawing on the distinction between safety and security as spoken of by Dr. Vijender earlier, Ms. Pandey said that the lack of safety is a source of constant fear. It is this constant form of covert terror which needs to be tackled. All forms of sexual violence are so prevalent, that it has been normalised. There is an urgent need to revamp our thinking and practices, so as to bring about a new normal. It is imperative to ensure voice, choice, agency and security of all women.

Prof. Raj Kumar, Vice Chancellor, O.P. Jindal Global University, was the knowledge partner for the event. He was so moved and overwhelmed by the thoughts that had been shared that he offered to continue this project till it reaches the last stage where policy makers incorporate the recommendations that emerge out of this seminar.

The Plenary Session dealt with the issue of Current Policy and Legal System on Women Safety. Dr. Sanjeev Sahni, Director of Jindal Institute of Behavioural Sciences said that every individual shares their experience from ages 0-7, which is usually almost entirely shaped by the parents. Therefore, parents play an integral role in shaping the ideas, beliefs and thinking of their child. He stressed on the importance of good parenting, which is largely absent. He also spoke about his University’s commitment to make the society balanced and equipped to share good practices, increasing knowledge on women’s inclusion and right to the city.

Dr. Udit Raj, Member of Parliament, and National Chairman of All India Confederation of SC/ST Organisation, said that we are engulfed in a day of massive caste inequalities, all pervading gendered stereotyped roles, and ugly everyday sexism. There is an urgent need for reform. However, this reform cannot be limited to just one aspect, instead, must be expanded to all forms of social reform. There is a need to ensure a much greater level of inclusive participation from women and girls. He describes in detail the best practices that the BJP Govt. adopted for ST and SC communities.

Deepender Pathak, IPS Special Commissioner, Delhi Police delivered in his speech the best police efforts to make Delhi secure for everyone including women.

The second session was chaired by Naresh Kumar, Vijay Shekhar Sharma, President PayTM, Prof Ashok Kumar, School of Planning and Architecture, Bharat Bhushan, Town Planner, SDMC, Dr. Rakhi, & Nandita Bhatt were the speakers.

During Third session –The Role of civil society & Media vibrant views were exchanged. Dr Kavita Sharma, President SAU, Omkareshwar Pandey, Editor ANI, Chandan Mitra, Pioneer were the speakers.

Fourth session which was on the topic **International Best Practices & Potential methods to improve safety in Delhi** had the following speakers: Uday Pratap Singh, VC, DDA, Dr. Kalpana Viswanath, Co-founder & CEO of Safetipin, Dr. Debjani Ghosh, NIUA & Suprabhat Majumdar, Chief Librarian, IIC.

The key stake holders, including Govt Officials, Civil Society Organizations, academicians and public representatives deliberated over a range of issues related to women safety in public spaces and otherwise. In view of the SDG 11 on

building sustainable cities and communities, SDG 5 on Gender equality and the New Urban Agenda need immediate action in Delhi.

The deliberations concluded to secure and further build on commitments to provide universal access to safe, inclusive and accessible public spaces, in particular for women and children, older persons and persons with disabilities.

Two Days Seminar By Sampurna In Association With UN Habitat Presents Urban Thinker Campus Phase 2: Making Delhi A Women Friendly City

The valedictory session of Sampurna in Constitution club saw a fiery moment when recommendations were presented by the founder president of Sampurna Dr. Shobha Vijender & (Prof). Dr. Sanjeev P. Sahni, JIBS, JGU to the political class including Vinay Sahasrabudhe, Vijender Gupta and Manoj Tiwari. The recommendations, after one and a half day deliberations, need immediate intervention by the policy makers. Garima Jain, coordinator presented the recommendations before the house. The recommendations are as follows:

- Develop and strengthen policies and programmes, and allocate resources to adequately and effectively address all forms of violence against women and girls in public and work spaces.

- Strengthen existing mechanisms like the Core Committee on Women’s Safety and other related Special Task Forces.
- Collect, analyse and disseminate sex disaggregated data, including social intersections, to inform the conceptualisation of the programmes.
- Develop municipality-wide plans and engender budgeting processes and initiatives which address women’s safety
- Provide reliable and safe transport for diverse women and girls.
- Establish mechanisms that ensure the active and effective participation of women in decision making and leadership roles at all levels, such policy planning and resource allocation.
- Organise periodic campaigns to engage with men and boys, families and public at large on gender inequalities and violence against women and girls.
- Ensure the provision of adequate treatment and emergency shelter, transition housing and social services for women and their children, victims of violence, either through public services or by funding civil society and NGO services.
- Develop training and capacity-building across all relevant municipal sectors in the prevention and treatment of violence against women in both private and public settings.
- Collaborate with women’s groups and other stakeholder to monitor and evaluate implementation of ongoing policies and programmes.
- Developing a holistic approach, including social, political and economic measures to address women’s safety concerns. This would include access to land, infrastructure, housing, inclusion of the marginalized, community-driven development, investment in crime and violence prevention, citizen engagement, access to jobs and opportunities for all, education and skill building etc.

Social Education is to be imparted to make society cohesive and harmonious at large and specifically for women. The participants from the leading educational institutes and colleges were presented mementoes by the dignitaries. Dr. Shobha Vijender's press release says that one and a half day long ***Urban Thinkers Campus- Making Delhi a Women Friendly City*** is very educative, informative, and a fruitful discourse where the eminent academicians, judiciary, civil societies as well as social activists gathered to deliberate the thoughts and notes. Under the aegis of **Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission 2016** being run by Sampurna, Dr. Shobha Vijender, Founder President, visited Schools of North Delhi Municipal Corporation in Rithala Vidhan Sabha Area. Shri Vinod Mahendru, area Municipal Councilor as well as volunteers of **Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission 2016** also accompanied her during the inspection.

Under **Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission** which started more than a year ago, volunteers of Sampurna did not only visit and inspect toilets in various schools but also helped them to keep clean and usable.

During inspection of schools, members of the team expressed satisfaction over the sanitation conditions in toilet of all schools. There was only one school where there was no proper facility of water. Principal of the school was requested to make appropriate arrangements for the same. Dr Shobha Vijender also appealed to the principals as well as school teachers to take inspiration from Swachh Bharat Abhiyan of our Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi. They must ensure that soap and clean water were available in school toilets which should also be kept clean at all the times.

In this connection, Dr Shobha Vijender also shared her thoughts about the Bal Diwas with a group of about 200 students who were taking part in preparations for the day and also inspired them to keep their schools, homes and surroundings neat and clean.

Dr. Shobha Vijender thanked Shri Vinod Mahendru, area Municipal Councilor, volunteers of **Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission**, teachers and students for their cooperation in inspection of schools.

2ND NOVEMBER 2017

Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission-2016 Inspects Toilets Of Nagar Nigam Schools Under Burari Vidhansabha Constituency

Under the **Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission-2016**, Sampurna Founder President, Dr Shobha Vijender visited Nagar Nigam Schools under Burari Vidhan Sabha Constituency. Municipal Councilors of the Area, Kasturba Balodi, Shri Anil Tyagi, Smt Kalpana Jha and Rekha Sinha also accompanied her during these visits.

Under the mission, volunteers of Sampurna not only visit and inspect toilets in various schools but also help them to keep clean and usable.

During inspection of schools, the team observed that the condition of toilets of almost all Nagar Nigam Schools in the area was bad and far from satisfactory. Neither water nor soap was available in these toilets and they were full of dirt. The team asked the officials and the principals of these schools to take urgent necessary measures for providing water and soap in the school toilets and see that these toilets are usable at all times.

Dr. Shobha Vijender also appealed to the principals and school teachers to take inspiration from Swachh Bharat Abhiyan of our beloved Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi and see that school toilets were usable and that water and soap are available for washing hands.

Dr Shobha Vijender also advised the students of these schools to learn and help in keeping their schools, homes and surroundings clean and green. She also thanked Municipal Councilors and volunteers of Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission for extending their cooperation in inspection of schools.

A delegation led by Dr Shobha Vijender also met Commissioner SDMC to seek cooperation for inspection of Nagar Nigam Schools under South Delhi Municipal Corporation. It was decided that the work to improve infrastructure and other improvements will start from Sangam Vihar Vidhansabha Constituency.

Director of Education Dept. said that he will start the work for improvement of school toilets from Sangam Vihar. Dr Shobha Vijender said that survey of all Nagar Nigam Schools in Delhi has revealed that 40% of the school toilets fall in Category A, 30% schools toilets fall in Category B and remaining 30 % fall in Category C. Sampurna pledges that it will help in clean toilets and, wherever necessary, caution the officers also.

Dr Shobha Vijender said that to fulfill the dream of our Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi Ji, Sampurna will leave no stone unturned to make school toilets neat, clean and usable.

3RD NOVEMBER 2017

Children are our future: If they are deprived of clean school toilets, the dream of Swachh Delhi-Swasth Delhi cannot be realized

Dr. Shobha Vijender, Founder President Sampurna addressed a Press Conference. She informed the reporters that based on cleanliness and other parameters, a survey of 455 Schools under Delhi Government and Municipal Corporation was conducted last year. It has been found that as per these norms 40 % of Schools fall in category A, 30 % in category B and remaining 30 % in category C.

Dr Shobha Vijender, Founder President Sampurna informed that in view of this situation, her NGO is inspecting Municipal Schools in various Vidhan Sabha constituencies. During the inspection, it was found that much more efforts are

needed to be made to make the school toilets neat, clean and usable. She told that for last year and a half, the volunteers of Sampurna are visiting toilets of Govt. Schools every fortnight with a view to make them usable. A report is prepared. Dr. Shobha requested Principals of various Government Schools to create awareness among the students about how to keep the toilets neat and clean and also how to use them.

Shri Anil Goel Convenor of Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission in South Delhi inspected a number of Nagar Nigam Schools. East Delhi has 365, North Delhi has 760 and South Delhi has 581 Schools. Every School has almost 3-9 toilet seats but majority of these toilets lack ventilation, have broken doors, no exhaust fans, no light, broken washbasins, no soap and water. It appears that toilets were not a priority for schools at all.

Dr. Shobha Vijender has been meeting Commissioners of the three Civic Bodies and requesting them that to implement Swachh Bharat campaign of Prime Minister. It was most important to make school toilets neat, clean and usable. Departments of Education of the three Municipal Corporations and the Delhi Government should provide soap in all Government Schools for washing hands. It is also often seen that school toilet are so dirty and full of foul smell that students are forced to go out for urinating. A number of students do not use these dirty toilets throughout the day. In both these situations, it adversely affects the health of the students.

Dr. Shobha Vijender said that the students and the staff should be provided training about washing their hands properly with soap. Neat, clean and usable toilets are necessary to fulfill resolve of Swachh Delhi-Swasth Delhi.

Apprising about Sampurna, Dr. Shobha Vijender said that the NGO has been working since 1993 for women empowerment, upliftment of the downtrodden, children education in slum areas and making them self-reliant by developing their

skills. Finding insecurity among women in Delhi, Sampurna has imparted training to the women and the girls in self-defense with the help of Delhi Police and made thousands of these girls fearless. Considering the rising incidents of rapes and cases of sexual harassment, Sampurna is running a number of successful projects for women security and self-defense. A number of projects have been run for upliftment of children and the youth. So far lakhs of women have been made self-reliant by providing them training in computer education, beautician courses, stitching, taxi driving etc.

Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi launched the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan on October 2, 2014, Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. Taking forward this campaign of our Prime Minister, Sampurna decided to launch Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission. This Mission was launched in January 2016 and is an ambitious project of Sampurna. It was decided to make all toilets in schools of three Municipal Corporations neat, clean and usable by removing all shortcomings in these toilets and to train students in a manner that maintaining cleanliness becomes part of their lives.

11TH NOVEMBER 2017

ASSOCIATE MEMBERS MEETING

Today, Dr Shobha Vijender presided over the Associate Members meeting. The Swachhta leaders of nearby locations were also present to share their experiences. Shivani Gautam firstly took the lead to initiate the discussion. She told the members that out of 16 Assemblies in East Delhi, 13 assemblies are doing well as in every 13 assemblies, ward leaders have started working and school toilets are regularly supervised and maintained. According to Shivani, the VSLs and WSLs always request that Dr Shobha Vijender should also visit their school toilets. Hence, Shivani requested Dr Shobha Vijender to visit East Delhi more.

Nirmala Chahal, another leader of North Delhi also said that some of the VSLs and WSLs are doing excellent work but some of them need to be replaced as they are not so active. Dr Shobha Vijender answered that the coordinators could tell the members that in every ward we should also do Swachhta Rally. All the members immediately raised their hands in affirmation. Hence, it was decided that in every ward Rally would be organized to create awareness among the masses to keep their neighborhood, schools, colleges and working places clean.

The Vice President of Sampurna told the members that in the month of December, mass examination of Stitching and Beautification Course would be held. She requested the members to motivate more girls to learn skills to be able to have gainful employment. The new counselors who recently joined Sampurna Family Counseling Center were introduced to the members. Diksha and Vishakha, who did their masters in psychology, have joined us. During a small introductory session, the counselors introduced themselves. They even shared two stories where they wanted to start a mass movement regarding women security. According to them, Sampurna should take more initiative to make the society women friendly.

The volunteers were keenly interested in joining Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission 2016. So, Dr Shobha said that very soon a screening committee would be held to select the volunteers so that able volunteers could give their best for Delhi School Adarsh Toilet Mission 2016. Small administrative points were also discussed in the meeting.
