**1<sup>ST</sup> APRIL 2021**

Sampurna is arranging and feeding 100 children & 50 needy people nutrition lunch on daily basis. these children and their mothers are coming to our centre following covid-19 protocol. Sampurna believes in overall development of the children and to inculcate the moral values among them, children are told to greet everyone and chant the shlokas to thank the god before starting eating. On 1<sup>st</sup> April it was also the birthday of the treasurer of Sampurna, Nirmala, which was celebrated with the children. Children enjoyed, Sampura distributed small gifts to them to mark the special occasion.

**5<sup>TH</sup> APRIL 2021**

Dr Shobha Vijender, the Founder of Sampurna & Kauser Jahan, coordinator of Madhu Vihar Centre Trans Yamuna, organized a personality development session with the beneficiaries of cutting, tailoring and beautician course. The session was organized to interact with the beneficiaries and inculcate in them the virtue of self confidence and boldness. The session was aimed at the Overall development of the person which is very crucial and plays an important role in making him successful. The Founder President gave them inspiration to strengthen themselves for defeating the challenges of job. The term of the beneficiaries completed in the month of April & New admission started in both the courses. So it was the mixed crowd of the beneficiaries. The number of the beneficiaries was fiftyfive. Dr Shobha Vijender appreciated the efforts of the instructor there to keeping a harmonious relationship with the beneficiaries. In the end, the coordinator gave a vote of thanks to the beneficiaries and the staff for their efforts. started in Sampurna, Madhu Vihar. **09<sup>TH</sup> APRIL 2021**

Sampurna FCC tries to generate awareness among the women folk about their self dignity and pride. Sometimes violence and abuse is so prevalent within the family of the beneficiary that they start believing that it is nothing but their fate to live the life as coming to them. Sampurna FCC organized the talk on the subject - Role of civil society in prevention against women and children. Mansi Gupta, the legal advisor to Sampurna was the speaker. The participants were the beneficiary of FCC and their families. Mansi gupta started her conversation by ice breaking session. The women were requested to answer the questions asked by the legal advisor to know their situation at home. She

asked the question – How do they run the home ? where does the money come from to run the house ? who do you ask for the money ? once you spend the money , are you answerable for how and where you spend the money ? are your male members satisfied with the answers you give ? it was a very fruitful session and the beneficiaries were made aware of the violence that does and could be done to them .

## **10<sup>TH</sup> APRIL 2021**

Associate Member meeting was held virtually keeping in the view of Corona pandemic.

## **17<sup>TH</sup> APRIL TO 29<sup>TH</sup> APRIL 2021**

Corona is at its peak. The second wave of Corona is devastating sosampurna designed a new strategy to reach covid patients and their families. SmtHina and Shefali were the coordinators of this programme. The Mobile Team consisting of 8 members were assigned to reach every household to provide any person who needs food. The team consists of Sagar Agarwal, Shivam, Anil Chopra, Vinay katariya,Pankaj Agarwal, Kusum Bahel,Smita Kaushik, Brijesh Kaushik. The procedure followed was very apt for the crisis situation as anyone whosoever needs food has to whatsapp his/her number of food packets to hina and then she whatsapp to the mobile team, who used to alocate them location wise and provide the food to these families at their doorsteps. The program was later continued for two months. It is to be noted a large number of migrant workers Rikshawala and their family was served hot and cooked food in premises of sampoorna too. Smt Santosh Garg was the coordinator of thisprogramme.

## **10<sup>TH</sup> MAY 2021**

The program started by smthina and Shefali continued till date and became a huge success. MrJath Mehta became a part of the team and one of the biggest donors of the program by contributing 200 packets of lunch to the needy people at their doorsteps.

## **12<sup>TH</sup> MAY 2021**

18 team members of sampurna did the cleanliness drive in the premises of sampurna. It was a big day where all the members came together to clean the area as on this day Sampurna was going to open a new post covid centers with the help and support of the local MLA Shri vijendra Gupta.

## **15<sup>TH</sup> MAY 2021**

On 15<sup>th</sup> May, Saturday, Sampurna with the support of local MLA Shri Vijender gupta opened a covid care centre. The covid care centre is meant for the patients who needed post covid care facilities in their neighbourhood. The post covid care centre was inaugurated by Hans Raj Hans, MP. It is a 10 bedded centre with oxygen cylinders and the medicines needed for the patients suffering from covid 19. The medical doctor and nursing staff was also arranged for 24 hours. The services providing covid care in Sampurna is a step forward to handle the crisis situation emerged due to the second

wave of corona. The management, volunteers and donors decided to dedicate themselves in response to the worsening situations in covid times.

## **14th August - Associate members meeting**

An associate members meeting was held today at sharp 11:30 in the premises of sampurna. The meeting was done very energetically as the new members of the financial year ( 2021-2022) attended the meeting. The meeting had the following agenda :-

### **1. Discussion on training workshop in month of september**

Dr shobha vijender, former president sampurna discussed with the members that sampurna is contacting grassroot organizations to participate in the training workshop. A team of volunteers and staff is given the task to contact and coordinate with the small time organizations working in their neighbourhood to understand the importance of Capacity building for Better Functioning of the social welfare organization. Dr shobha vijender who is herself a social worker believes in that professional social work is the need of the hour. The working president smt Asha Jain was also of the opinion that sampurna has been the mentor of many organizations in the past too. After Corona , we should contact the community based organizations for a purposeful coordination and networking. Tanvi, the general secretary was assigned the task to book the constitution club in the first or second week of September for the training workshop. She was nominated as The coordinator of the program.

### **2. 30+ Mariage beaurau by Sampurna**

**Sampurna believes in experiments. We believe that the problems of the society are always complex. It has been observed for the last 10 years when the beneficiary are coming to the counselling centre, the complain about their own daughters and sons. in a recent case a women aged 55 years is continuously harassed by her own son because her two sons of the age 35 and 33 are not married. The problem has become so acute that the women wanted to run away from her house. When discussed with the counsellors it was planned that sampurna takes the responsibility to get them married when they are 30 .+Its a noble project which is needed the most ,specially in the metropolitan cities where noone else tries to get involved in the matrimonial matters and the matrimonial sites and agencies are too commercial and sometimes do not hesitate to decieve both the parties. Smt Asha Jain, the working president told the members that the project is going on very well every tuesday and friday 11-1 free of cost in the premises of sampurna**

**3. To restart the outreach Programs**

Nirmala Chahal, The treasurer raised the point that sampurna should restart its outreach program because the society needs sampurna. Aanchal Dahiya, another executive member requested Dr Shobha Vijender to consider the fact that still a few beneficiaries dare to reach the doors of sampurna. Awareness generation is a problem of people belonging to all income groups. so it was planned that all members along with staff and volunteers would start their outreach program soon. in the end Tanvi grover thanked all the members and the meeting ended with a promise to work more and more for the society.

## **20th August**

Sampurna organizes small business women to showcase their work through 'mahila haat' in the premises of sampurna every friday. In the chain of empowering women, her economic independence is also an important feature. many atimes it is observed that women are subjected to all types of violence at their homes because they have to depend for a penny on their male members. secondly, due to corona many women are deprived of their basic needs which they were fulfilling through their earnings before corona. Keeping in view both the reasons sampurna planned to organize these women for marketing their products in a small venture named mahila haat in sampurna. On 20th august many women came with their homemade rakhis , sweets , clothes and other art and craft items to diisplay and sell in Mahila Haat. Smt Asha Jain , the working president, is the coordinator of Mahila Haat who reported that 10 stalls were installed on this friday

## **10th September 2021**

A zoom meeting was organized in the evening for giving final touch to the 11th september training workshop. All the members were quite enthusiastic to make the program a success. Even the

coordinators of rajasthan , uttar pradesh, bihar and karnataka also joined the meeting. Dr Shobha Vijender, the founder president , discussed the final touch of the program with the participants. it was decided that the speakers will be requested to speak in hindi keeping in view that many grassroot organizations are coming for the training workshop. In the end Tanvi Grover thanked the members for their support and coordination.

## **11<sup>th</sup> September - SAMVARDHANI**

11<sup>th</sup> September sampurna organized a workshop at Constitution Club, Rafi Marg, New Delhi 110001 from 3-6 pm. The training program aimed to bring networking and coordination. The workshop was attended by a large number of NGO's working in varied fields. The program was designed to support the small organizations for their capacity building. It was appreciated by not only the practicing volunteers only but the policy makers and the schools of social work in delhi and outside. The programme was started with the lightening of lamp by the executive of Sampurna and the guest came for the programme.

During the first session **Lalitha Kumaramangalam** the former chairperson of NCW, talked about how we could empower our existing agencies by working under one roof, resulting in reduction of overall per capita expenditure. She also emphasized on the fact that if beneficiary is one individual the relief should also come from a single unified agencies instead of numerous ones. She pointed out that while we realise that government cannot work without its departments, NGOs and Government can come together to work for social welfare in order to have a better reach.

**Rashmi Singh** secretary of social welfare govt of Delhi gave the steps to converge. She gave ample examples of convergence for better functioning in voluntary sector. She pointed out how resources help the individuals achieve their desired outcome to have better convergence.

**Onkareshwar Pandey**, senior editor, who has a rich experience of working with voluntary sector said that India has divergence and diversity and that without convergence we cannot work successfully on our goals. With technology, with different expertise of various NGOs and with different individual inputs with different idea we can have a positive impact on the society through social welfare.

He supported the initiative by Sampurna to bring 100 organizations under one umbrella to reach out to people with digital media to tell benefits of govt schemes.

In the second session which was about handling crisis situation was eye opener as speakers narrated the stories of voluntary organizations working in remote areas where it was very difficult to access the services of the govt but the voluntary organizations did the noticeable work by providing food, medicine, transport and other facilities to survive in the covid times.

**Padma Shree Dr. Jitender Singh Shuntysh**ed light on the fact that experience is more important than textual knowledge. NGOs should be further motivated by the govt for their commendable work in a time of crisis that the country wasn't ready for so that they have motivation to work in a much more efficient manner in the future.

**Sanjeev Srivastav**, renowned social worker currently working with Rashtriya Antyodaya Sang as a consultant said that some people have immense capacity building but it is of no use when they don't want to work for social welfare. Similarly, there are people who are very concerned about the society and social welfare but don't have the apt training, networks or resources to have an impactful reach. He pointed out that we should learn from the smallest examples and build up to increase our knowledge which can prove to be beneficial in a crisis situation. Local examples can help in crisis situation.

The third session was very informative to determine the concerning factors, and accordingly, train the volunteers in networking and coordination.

**Dr Rakesh Sinha** MP Rajya Sabha showed his concerns about how women are the most marginalized in our country. He encouraged to learn from the people who have experience in working in the field of social welfare and build upon their knowledge. He emphasized on the fact that an NGO works to develop the people's potential which, in the long run, will have tremendous impact on the development of the country and society. Further said, the sex workers whom he named "sex slaves" is the group that need to be targeted by the social sector.

**Sunil Deodhar** the national secretary of BJP and the founder of MY HOME INDIA FOUNDATION pointed out that technology has helped to take out the middle man and terminate corruption when it comes to receiving help from the government. If we work with a better understanding, we should be able to show each other's strengths and help overcome our shadows. He said that we need collaborations in order to help people and that collaborations cannot be obtained without trust. Trust is

a necessary factor in efficient working of an NGO and its partnership. "Trust cannot be bought. It can only be earned". He said that in today's era many people are doubtful about the role of NGO's in the development of the country. Therefore he said that intention and presentation of the ngo's should be clear and sincere.

31<sup>st</sup> January 2022

A meeting was held in Raja Vihar under the able coordinator Smita Kaushik. The potential members of Self Help Group attended the meeting. The social worker Ms Steffy told the beneficiaries about the benefits of Self Help Group. The potential members were very keen to form the Self Help Group as all the women belong to the poor income groups. Steffy told them about Sampurna and its initiative to encourage the women from the vulnerable section of the society to unite and form Self Help Group. Steffy told the members one such group has opened its account in Govt. Bank and ladies are very happy to form such a group.

The financial year 2021-22 is going to be end soon, hence it was decided to call the meeting of the AGM in the next month most probably before the next associate members meeting in the month of March. The President then intervenes to fix up the date on 10<sup>th</sup> March for the AGM. The Treasurer, Nirmala was given the responsibility to inform the members to ensure their presence for the AGM. The General Secretary Tanvi Grover informed the members that 25 members from 8 states have given their consensus to form Sampurna at All India Level.
